

## Stockton Globe

- The building is Grade II listed and has been vacant since 1996
- The freehold is owned by developer Jomast; the Council agreed a 999-year lease on the building in 2017.
- The project was awarded a Heritage Enterprise funding (£4.5 million); the remainder of the works are being financed by the Council through a loan
- The Council have signed a 25-year operating agreement with global operator ATG.
- Enabling works have commenced with the main building works to follow shortly.
- It has been estimated that the restored and reopened building will bring in the region of 170,000+ visitors to Stockton town centre every year, significantly boosting the economy (reported estimates of an £18m boost to the local economy each year).

## Bradford Odeon

- The building is owned by the Council; Bradford Live, a not-for-profit charity were successful in a 2014 bid to gain the right to re-develop the building.
- Bradford Live has done much work to make the building secure and wind and watertight, as well as developing proposals for the restoration of the Odeon.
- The Council has contributed towards some of the urgent repair works for the building (eg reroofing the domes) and has been supporting Bradford Live in applications to the LEP and other funding bodies. The Council has also agreed to provide a major loan towards the costs of the restoration works (£12 million).
- Bradford Live has secured the NEC group as operator for the venue on a 30-year lease. NEC group will also be contributing £2 million towards the cost for restoration.
- Further funding towards the estimated £20 million cost is from the LEP, who have provided funding for the enabling works and also championed and were successful in achieving major funding for the Odeon through the Northern Cultural Regeneration Fund (£4 million)
- Funding is also being sought from the HLF (£1 million)
- Enabling works have just commenced.
- Once completed, the venue is expected to host over 200 events a year, attracting 270,000 people to Bradford city centre annually and boosting the local economy by around £10 million per year.

## Walthamstow Granada (EMD)

- The Council have announced their intention to purchase the Granada. The site is due to be purchased for £2.6 million from the current owners, EMD Walthamstow LLP.
- The building will be fully restored to bring it back to its former glory and create a destination venue.
- The Council is currently looking for options to part finance the renovation of the building.
- The Council has announced that it is in discussion with Soho Theatre over Heads of Terms to operate the theatre. Soho's ambitions are for a mixed programme focussed on comedy but also including an annual pantomime, screenings, theatre and community education work.
- The Council has estimated that a reopened and renovated site could add between £34 and £52 million to the local economy over a ten year period.
